

Captivating palates the world over, soy sauce was first produced in Japan in this rural area of Wakayama. It is also the home of the most famous Japanese salt-pickled ume (Japanese Apricot) relish, umeboshi,



been thought to be the mythical "holy ground where gods dwell." During the Heian period (794 - 1185), the Imperial household and court made the 30 to 40 day arduous journey from the ancient capital of Kyoto to this remote area, in search of heaven on earth. It is here that Kumano Sanzan, the three grand shrines and Nachisan Seiganto-ji Temple, were established.



Shirahama /Kushimoto

Unspoiled natural landscapes abound in Shirahama and Kushimoto. These areas boast some of the best beaches in all of Kansai (south-central Japan), and are home to historic onsen areas, as well as offering coral reefs said to be a diver's paradise.
